A Report on Our Recent Ministry Activities

On the 11th of June, I met with key Senior Pastors of the local township of Lephalale called Marapong, translated in English as 'The place of



the bones.' Together with my associate, Menzi Shezi, we did a presentation proposing for a crusade to be held at the local stadium in August. The meeting was very good, with the relevant pastors committing to work with us in hosting this evangelistic crusade. A more recent update will be emailed to all of you, informing you of the final crusade date in August and our progress in ensuring that the campaign is a great success.

Meeting With Pastors of Marapong

Those who have never heard the message of Jesus before are eagerly turning to Him. But... 'How then shall they call on Him whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach, except they be sent?' (Romans 10:14, 15, KJV). Gospel Harvest International has specifically targeted this largely unreached people group of Limpopo. Those in such unreached lands need to hear the message of Christ more than any other. Should we not do all that we can to send the Gospel to them?

On the 18th of June I ministered at Bishop Mogorosi's church, The Lord is My Shepherd, in Marapong. I ministered a message on **Revelation 4:1** about an 'Open Heaven.' The meeting was tough in the beginning with the atmosphere being very closed, but by the grace of God I managed to break through the atmosphere during the ministry time, with God confirming His Word with prophetic words, words of knowledge & wisdom and healings.

Saturday the 24th of June, we were invited to minister at two churches on the same day. I chose to minister at Ps Twala's church, which is the church we go to as a family on Sundays when I am not ministering called, 'His Dwelling Place.' I did a Youth service for Ps Twala, which was very well attended. To our appreciation, we were very well received and the service was enjoyed by all those present. Youth ministry is not popular here in Lephalale, with a lot of the Youth who attended having never been to such a service before. At this service I ministered a message on 'Responsibility,' challenging the Youth with this thought, "**The most basic habit of highly effective people in any environment is the habit of pro-activity and more than taking initiative, it's recognising our responsibility.**"
